Youth Philanthropy Council 2025



The Youth Philanthropy Council is an educational program of the Community Foundation of the Central Blue Ridge that is led and facilitated here in Highland County by The Highland Center.

The Youth Philanthropy Council is comprised of student volunteers from Highland County High School who learn about the importance of philanthropy and how to investigate causes and organizations that they may wish to support. This year, thirteen teens from all high school grade levels are participating in the program.



This month, students will agree on their funding priorities for 2025 and a grant application will be made available to nonprofits serving Highland County.

The council members will then take on the task of reading and evaluating each grant application as they decide how to allocate \$10,000 in grant money.
